PRESENTATIONS

- * Elvia Teixeira, Principal of Washington Elementary School, and Mary Camezon, School Assistance and Intervention Team (SAIT) consultant, will present highlights from the schools' fourth SAIT Monitoring Report. The presentation will include progress that has been made towards implementing the SAIT corrective action plan, ratings that the school has received for each component of the plan, and next steps that the school will be focused on as they move toward the end of their second year as a SAIT school.
- * Members of the Elementary and Secondary Safe School Support teams, along with Cindy M. Cathey, Assistant Superintendent for Educational Services, and Barry Chersky, the district's consultant, will present an overview of the work of each team in support of the district's goal of schools that are safe for all students, including our gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender students and staff.

The presentation will include a review of the district's policies, the Education Code, and other relevant statutes. The Safe School Support Teams will summarize the professional development for teachers, staff and administrators that has been undertaken, including showing excerpts from video documentaries. A schedule for providing parents with an opportunity to preview lessons and books will be provided. This presentation will not include any discussion or decisions related to the elementary safe space poster. However, a timeline for the parents to provide feedback related to the elementary school safe space poster will be shared. This timeline will include the date of a future school board meeting to address the display of an elementary school safe space poster. Exhibit (2) 5145.3 will not be posted in the elementary classrooms pending this future meeting of the school board.
