

## FAMILY PROJECT

A big project in 2nd grade is the Family Project. Your student should have brought home a packet of Family Project assignments. In the coming weeks, expect students to ask you about the story of their name, a family immigration or migration story, family traditions, and celebratory outfits. We are asking students to write a paragraph about each of the above topics and present it to the class. So students may also be asking you to be their practice audience so they can practice their public speaking skills and gain confidence before reading to the class.

We did our first presentations on Tuesday. Many students were nervous about getting up in front of the class and speaking into a microphone to share the story of their names, but they bravely took on the task of public speaking and shared many beautiful and funny stories behind their names. It was a wonderful time of sharing and community building.

#### READING

We are wrapping up our animal unit by studying animal babies and poetry. Our current focus is the similarities and differences between parents and their offspring. Students have been learning to use boxes and bullets to take notes. They put the topic, or what the text is mostly about, in the box. Then they stop after reading each page and think about what they learned. They write notes in the bullets below the box.



#### Math

We will be wrapping up the place value unit in the next couple of weeks by comparing numbers using greater than, less than, and equal to and thinking about 1, 10, and 100 more and less than a number. ### SCIENCE

We introduced live mealworms to Room 4 in November. Students have been observing the mealworms closely and practicing their scientific illustration skills. They have been learning the ABCs of scientific drawing: scientific drawings are <u>A</u>ccurate, <u>B</u>ig, <u>C</u>olorful, <u>D</u>etailed, <u>E</u>xplained. Students are also measuring their mealworm and noting any other changes they notice from week to week.

While some students started off feeling nervous or squeamish about insects, all are now excited about getting the mealworms out to see how they have changed.
