Chabot College Concurrent Enrollment (taking classes at Chabot while attending SLHS)

All classes for the summer 2020 semester will be available online.

- Online classes are rigorous and require regular (almost daily) homework and checking in. Please make sure you are ready to put in the work before signing up.
- Chabot's summer course catalog will be available soon- hopefully within the next 1-2 weeks.

- Students must complete **both Chabot's online application and the concurrent enrollment form** before signing up for a class.

Financial Aid Update:



We understand that your family's financial circumstance may be impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic now or in the coming months. If your family's financial situation has changed, please reach out to the financial aid offices of the colleges you have been accepted if you would like them to reevaluate your financial aid eligibility or award package.

Students planning on attending a UC and whose families may be financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic now or in the coming months who believe that their situation requires a re-evaluation of their financial aid should

1. Utilize the campus [financial aid calculators](#) to determine if the change in their finances would affect the amount of financial aid they are eligible to receive.
2. If the calculator shows a change in financial aid eligibility they should contact the campus(es) that they have been admitted to for available appeal processes.
3. Contact information, including the best way to reach the financial aid office during remote operations, is available through the student's portal or on the financial aid website. Follow-up to students will be handled by email responses, or telephone calls or virtual meetings as needed.

*Such evaluations of financial aid are likely to occur later this summer, are considered on a case by case basis, and that process requirements can vary from campus to campus.

*Seniors who plan to attend Chabot should be checking their emails from Chabot weekly to determine what requirements they should be working on now to start classes in the Fall of 2020. Southern Oregon Update (SOU):

SOU has moved to become test optional. SAT or ACT scores are not required in order to be admitted to the university. However, students can still supply their scores through collegeboard.org or ACT.org. More information will follow about the awarding of scholarships based on the new admissions criteria.

- A first-year student can also *self-report their high school GPA* for admission to SOU. Self-reporting can be done through a written email to an Admissions Counselor (Jimmy Martin <martinj6@sou.edu>) or through the documentation of an unofficial transcript.
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- *Our Office of Admissions may still defer the \$60 application fee.* Students seeking to apply can select the “fee defer” button at the end of the apply.sou.edu application. The \$60 application fee will then be deferred to the first billing statement in the term in which they enroll. No payment would be needed at the time of application submission. Our office can also provide fee waivers for deserving students, based on counselor's discretion.

- *Applications remain open for Fall 2020.* These changes are effective for the class of Fall 2020 and beyond. We understand that we all are going through trying times so we want to support our students in every possible way.
