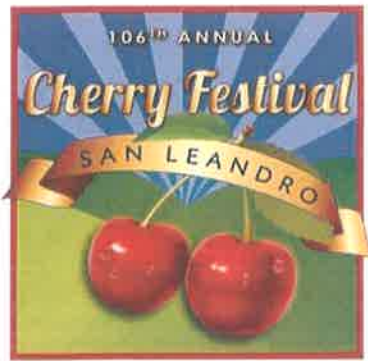
Roosevelt Elementary invites you to an open community event of a 5th grade Project-Based Learning (PBL), *Community Photojournalism*.
