Science Lab Support Teacher 2016-17

Job Description: Roosevelt School is seeking a part-time Science Lab Support Teacher who can design and implement science lab experiences aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards for students in grades TK - 5. This position could be split between two candidates who each focus on upper and lower grade instruction. The ideal candidate will have a love for science and children, be able to effectively manage whole group instruction, lab based science experiments, and collaborate with teachers to ensure continuity between lab experiences and general education science instruction. Credentialed, general education teacher will be present during all science labs.

Desired Qualifications:

- Prior experience with elementary age students
- Ability to develop and adapt lessons for multi-age groups
- Skilled at designing hands-on science experiences
- Strong classroom management skills

Scope of Work

19 classes (TK-5th)

820 minutes per week of instruction

13.6 hrs of instruction per week

Approx. 14 hrs of instruction (rounded up) + 6 hrs of prep per week = 20 hrs per week

25 weeks of instruction (Nov. 2016 - June 2017)

Approximate hourly rate = \$30/hour

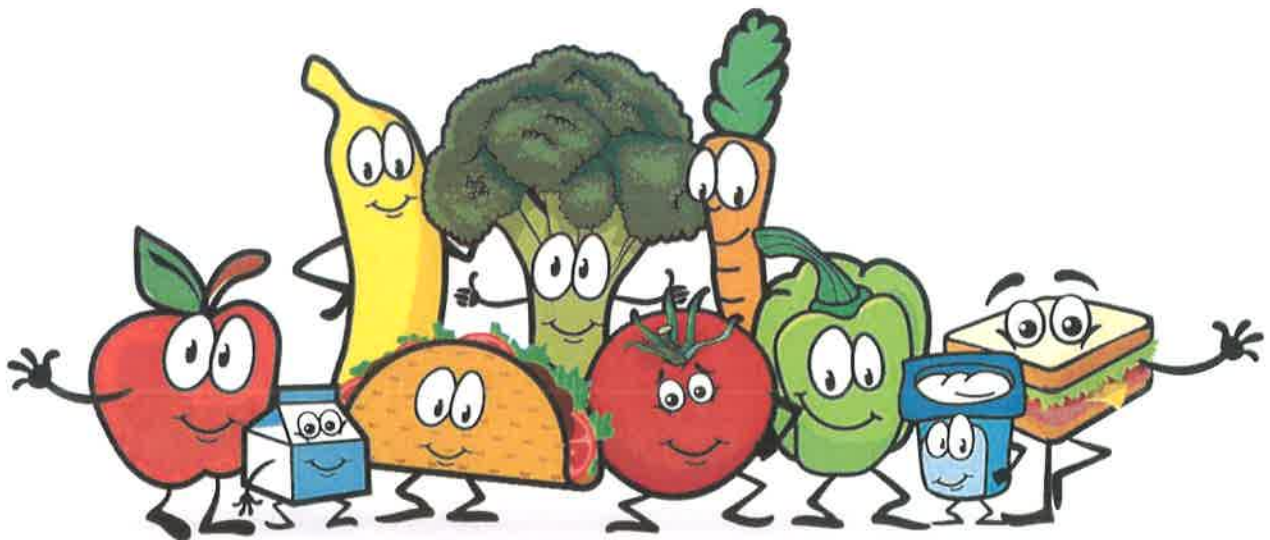

ATTENDANCE

If your child/children are going to be absent please make sure the front Office or teacher gets a note &/or a phone call to excuse your child/children within **48 hours of the absence.**

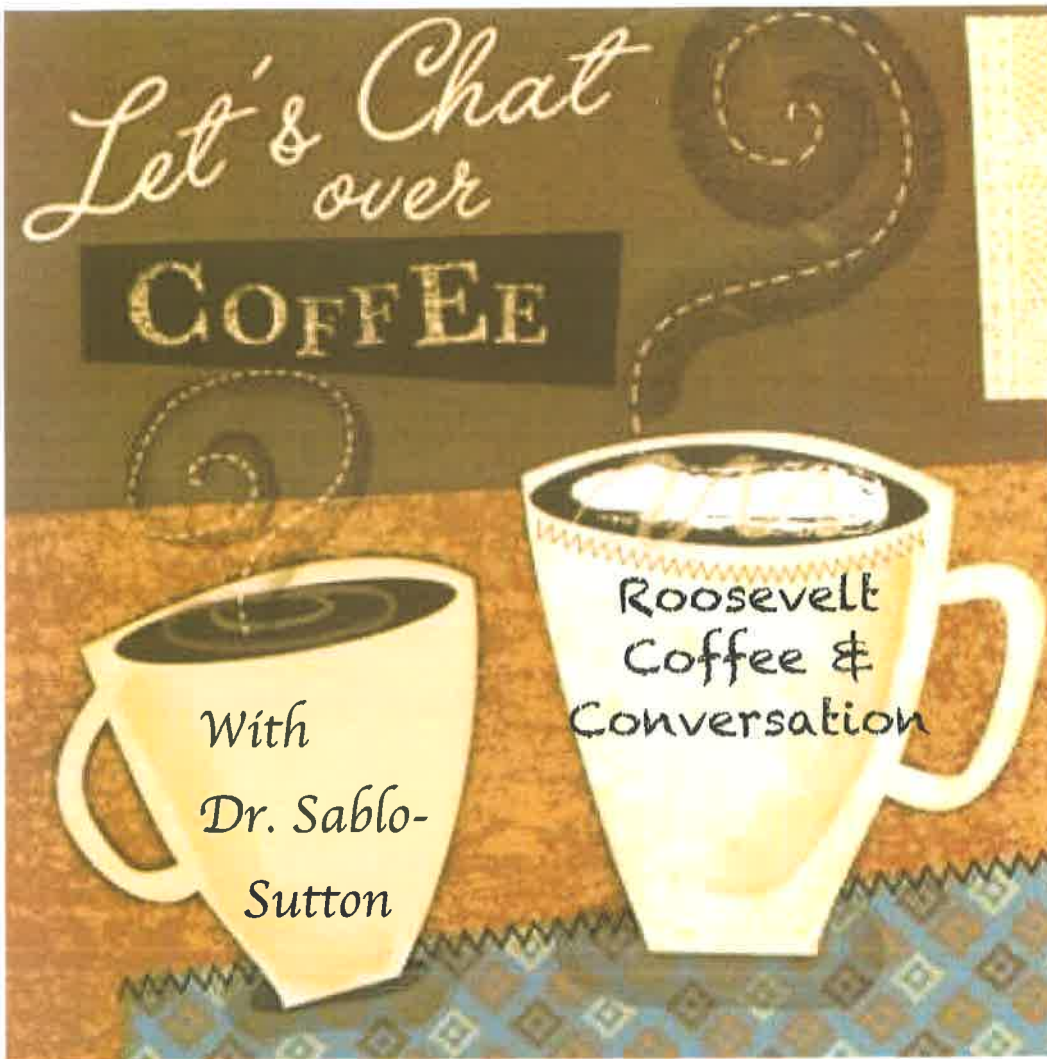
- **Excused** absences are Doctor/Dentist, illness or funeral (immediate family). There will be no excuse for vacations or days out of town (unless you are gone for more than **5** days and complete an Independent Study Contract).
- **UNVERIFIED** is if you don't excuse your child within 48 hours for their illness. Please make sure the teacher or front office has received your excuse. ***We cannot change unverified to excused after 48 hours.***
- **TARDY** is any time after the bell. Tardy bells are 8:10 & 9:30 (K's only). **THERE ARE NO EXCUSES FOR TARDIES AND THEY CANNOT BE ERASED.**
After 5 tardies you will receive a warning letter regarding your child's attendance.
- **VERY LATE** is 30 minutes or more and these also cannot be erased.
- **INDEPENDENT STUDY CONTRACT (5 days or more)**
Contracts can be picked up in the front Office. Please give your teacher(s) at least **one week** to prepare work for your child.
