For most of us, controlling our emotions and body comes fairly naturally. However for some people, this is not the case. Those with self-regulation difficulties lack this innate ability to think through and succeed in everyday situations. For them, emotional and/or self-regulation must be learned and practiced.

The Zones of Regulation® curriculum includes lessons and activities designed by Leah Kuypers, M.A., Ed., OTR/L to help students gain skills in the area of self-regulation. The lessons and learning activities are designed to help students recognize when they are in different "zones" (states of alertness/moods) and to teach them the strategies to regulate the zones they are in. In addition to addressing self-regulation, the students will be gaining an increased vocabulary of emotional terms, skills in reading facial expressions, perspective on how others see and react to their behavior, insight on events that trigger their behavior, calming and alerting strategies, and problem solving skills.

Zones training provide strategies to teach students to become more aware of and independent in controlling their emotions and impulses, managing their sensory needs and improving their ability to problem solve conflicts. Practical ideas are provided that can be easily incorporated into the classroom or home.

Leah Kuypers, M.A., Ed., OTR/L earned a BS in Occupational Therapy from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a Graduate Certificate in Autism, and an MA in Education from Hamline University in St. Paul, MN. She has practiced as an OT/Autism Specialist in school and clinical settings, specializing in self-regulation and social learning. She has worked with children of all ages and challenges, including anxiety, ADHD, and ASD. She has authored the curriculum **The Zones of Regulation®** which was designed to help foster self-regulation and emotional control. Leah currently lives in Minneapolis, MN with her family.

Does Your Child Crave a Math or Science Challenge?

For 2nd through 5th grade students: These classes are intended to be challenging. If you are unsure whether these classes are appropriate for your child's skill level, please consult your child's teacher before signing up.

TeachBar (tchbr.com) will teach both the math and the science classes. **For science this session: solve a mysterious crime scene** as a CSI scientist who will utilize and develop scientific inquiry, analysis, and techniques to figure out the perpetrator. The 2nd & 3rd grade math classes will be a mix of strategic games and Scratch programming. The 4th & 5th graders will be focused on learning computer programming.

Parent volunteers will be needed for the SCIENCE classes – this helps us keep costs down. Please sign up below. It's fun and science knowledge is not needed.

This 7-week session will cost \$75 per child for math/programming and \$75 per child for science. If you are able to contribute toward the cost of your child's classes, please include a check for what you can afford. If you are able to contribute more it will help ensure we can continue to include everyone. Checks should be made out to SLED with "MaSC" in the memo field. *All* Roosevelt children are welcome to attend our classes, regardless of their family's ability to donate. Any donation you are able to give is tax deductible and will help us to continue bringing these classes to your children and those of other families.

To sign your child up for the math/programming class, the science class, or both, please fill out the application and turn it in to the office by the end of school on Wednesday, September 30.

Classes this session run for **7 weeks**, starting Monday, Oct 5 and ending Tuesday, November 17.

Classes meet in room A-4 except 4th/5th Programming which meets in the computer lab. If you choose to participate, your child would attend one or two classes per week according to this schedule:
