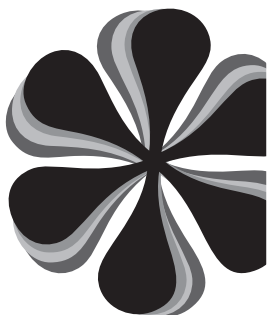

## \*\*\*\*\*Class Descriptions\*\*\*\*\*

**Animal Lover's:** This class is for the true animal lover! Have you ever heard of "Yakow"? It's a combination of a "Yak" and a "Cow" and lives in Tibet. You will learn about different types of animals plus create "animal art" like origami and clay figures! We'll have fun snacks plus **"Live Animal Guests!"** Taught by Mrs. Campi! **Grades K-3, Limit 16**

**Ballet Folklorico:** Please welcome back the Ballet Folklorico Dance studio to teach this fun new class. This class is designed to expose students to Mexican Folkloric Dance and to the history and traditions related to such dance form. This program will teach the basic fundamentals of the Folklorico dance. The performance aspect of Folklorico will be highly emphasized. This program has been successful teaching the importance of teamwork and in building self confidence for boys and girls! This class will perform at the **ACE Winter Program Thursday, December 18<sup>th</sup>. Grades 1-5, Limit 12**

**Bling It On:** Do you want to design your own **unique** art & accessories? Come on down dudes and dudettes and join Mrs. Campi in this fun class. We'll make a variety of **"Bling"** such as key chains, decorations for shoes, backpacks and hats, headbands, pins, medallions etc. We'll use different types of materials like wire, rubber, metal, plastics, leather, suede, beads, rhinestones and more! Do you have an idea for some "Bling"? Bring it to class! **Grades 2-5, Limit 10**

**Ceramic Arts:** Roosevelt Welcomes back "Aran's Art Studio" from Castro Valley, an exciting addition to the ACE Program. Projects will include: Clay, Tiles and Glass Fusing. Class fees include all materials and all projects will be glazed and fired at the studio. Just imagine how much Mom, Dad, Grandparents or any loved one will truly enjoy hand crafted pieces of art. **Grades 2-5, Limit 12**

**Cooking:** Look out Food Network! Come cook with Chef Campi in our ACE room kitchen. You will become more confident in the kitchen as you discover it really isn't as hard as it looks. Maybe you'll even get brave enough to cook dinner some night at home! You will learn how to measure, work different appliances, and prepare a wide variety of cuisine, from amazing sweets to savory entrees! Yummy! **Grades 2-5, Limit 12 per class.**

**Junior Acers:** This multi-topic ACE class targets Kinders and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade students. We will alternate weeks with age appropriate cooking, art, K'NEX and science projects. This is a **great introduction** to the ACE program! Mrs. Campi will provide students with variety while ensuring the young ones learn to work and create in a group setting while being comfortable with children their own age. **Grades K-1, Limit 12**

**Just Desserts:** Bring your "Sweet Tooth" to this fun new class, taught by Mrs. Campi. We will make all types of yummy creations such as cookies, brownies, crepes, toffee, and even "ice cream in a bag"! Prepare to get sticky and bring your creative dessert ideas to class! **Grades 2-5, Limit 12**

**K'NEX:** Boys and girls of all ages have great fun in this club! Learn to create incredible machines, vehicles, creatures and anything else you can imagine. Race your vehicles down the race track. Using the K'NEX system of rods and connectors, you can design machines with the use of gears, pulleys, wheels, and levers. **Grades K-5, Limit 16**

**Knitting:** We are excited to have Roosevelt's beloved noon supervisor Mrs. Smith, a "Knitting Guru", teach this amazing club. Learn the basics of knitting to make simple projects, such as a scarf, potholder, belt, etc. This class is for boys or girls and once you learn to knit, it's like riding a bike, you never forget! Advanced knitting kids will go on to learn crochet! **Grades 2-5, Limit 12**

**Songbirds:** Local musician, and Roosevelt Parent Alumni, Gloria Amaral, returns to lead Roosevelt Songbirds in another fall season of great music. Songbird's focus is to have fun singing in a positive and nurturing environment. We will incorporate movement while singing. We will focus on ear training (learning to sing on pitch), breath control; learn easy harmony all the while learning fun songs. The Songbirds will perform at the **ACE Winter Program Thursday, December 18<sup>th</sup>. Grades 1-5, Limit 12**

# Does Your Child Crave a Math or Science Challenge?

For 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students: These classes are intended to be challenging. If you are unsure whether these classes are appropriate for your child's skill level, please consult your child's teacher before signing up.

TeachBar (tchbr.com) will teach both the math and the science classes. For science this session, they will learn about chemistry and explore the elements, getting involved in designing their own experiments, making potions, mixing chemicals, and playing with dry ice. The 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> grade math classes will use games and projects to teach strategy and problem solving. The 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grade math time will be spent learning to program in Python. **Parent volunteers will be needed for the science classes – this helps us keep costs down. Please sign up below. It's fun and science knowledge is not needed.**

This 10-week session will cost \$95 per child for math/programming and \$90 per child for science. If you are able to contribute toward the cost of your child's classes, please include a check for what you can afford. If you are able to contribute more it will help ensure we can continue to include everyone. Checks should be made out to SLED with "MaSC" in the memo field. *All* Roosevelt children are welcome to attend our classes, regardless of their family's ability to donate. Any donation you are able to give is tax deductible and will help us to continue bringing these classes to your children and those of other families.

To sign your child up for the math/programming class, the science class, or both, please fill out the application below and turn it in to the office by the end of school on Tues, Sept. 9.

Classes this session run for **10 weeks**, starting Monday, September 15 and ending Friday, November 21.

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## What is the Math and Science Challenge (MaSC) Program?

The Math and Science Challenge (MaSC) offers advanced instruction for students who love science or have mastered their grade-level math curriculum and are hungry for more. The program offers advanced math and science after school classes which emphasize creativity and perseverance. The program was founded by and is administered by Roosevelt parents.

Approximately half of the class spaces will be reserved for students referred by their teachers because they are identified as being the most in need of advanced curriculum. The rest of the class spaces are available for open enrollment for students with enthusiasm for math or science.

The MaSC program is a public/private partnership funded entirely by private funds from San Leandro individuals and businesses.

## ATTENDANCE
