Teacher's Report

- Mr. Fishbaugh says that we have a new chromebook cart. At about a 2 to 1 ratio.

Principal's Report

- STAR Renaissance test scores will be sent home (grades 1-5). Will be tested again in January. (K-6)
- SBAC scores are out. Scores will come soon. Preview showed that Roosevelt outperformed other schools in district. But, there is still a racial and socio-economic gap here and in state.
- Walkathon – in 2 weeks. Total bill is something like \$30,000. 4th graders asked to raise about \$80 and 5th graders about \$250.00. This year 3rd grade will also do walkathon as a Pay it Forward Opportunity.
- Yearbook – Jenny Larson needs a co-editor. She would like to put something in the newsletter about getting help with specific things (5th grade baby pictures, help with collecting pictures from events)

Fundraising

- We are about to wrap up our first fundraiser Schoola. Have about 7 boxes so far. Has been a very successful and easy fundraiser. Made over \$1700 last year with 2 drives. Will start gift wrap fundraiser starting this week to Sept. 30. 25% of 4th and 5th grade sales raised will go to Outdoor Ed.
- A parent would like to look into a fundraiser to help buy workbooks so help kids and parents with math (specifically Common Core). Jamie has already discussed with Soraya to help find someone to help come in and help parents understand. There has also been discussion of a math lab similar to reading academy. There is a need to help parents so that they can help their students. There will be a note in the next newsletter how to help your kid with math (go to EngageNY to see actual lessons)

- We have 2 assemblies booked this year. Kaiser's Best of Me end of Sept and Draw with Me in May. Jamie is researching other ideas. Programs she is looking at are KidPower, Girl's Inc. and she is open to hearing new ideas.

Free and Reduced Meal Applications 2015-16 School Year

If you haven't already submitted your application **online**, please do so as soon as possible to avoid a lapse in your child's free status. If you do not have access to a computer, applications are available in your school office. Once your application has been processed, you will receive a notification letter in the mail. Only **one** application per family.

How to make payments to your child's account

- **On-line Payments:** It is recommended that all meals are prepaid online at www.MySchoolBucks.com. This online service offers you the opportunity to monitor your students account, receive notifications when their balance is low and to insure your child is confident in knowing their school meals are prepaid. The online account allows you to review the past 90 days of your student account transactions. Smartphone apps are available so you can make payments or check account balances from your phone!
- **Cash or Check Prepayments for Elementary Students:** Cash or check prepayments can be deposited in the lunch payment mailbox in the school office. Please place cash or checks in an envelope marked with the student's name and ID number on the outside. All prepayments received in the office before 10:00 am will be processed before lunch.

Charging Policy

We provide students with access to a variety of affordable and appealing foods that meet the health and nutrition needs of students. In order to provide the best Food Service Program possible, the Food and Nutrition Services Department can only allow students at the Elementary Schools to charge the equivalent of **two** days' worth of lunches to their account.

No charging allowed at Middle and High Schools.

Does Your Child Crave a Math or Science Challenge?

For 2nd through 5th grade students: These classes are intended to be challenging. If you are unsure whether these classes are appropriate for your child's skill level, please consult your child's teacher before signing up.

TeachBar (tchbr.com) will teach both the math and the science classes. **For science this session: solve a mysterious crime scene** as a CSI scientist who will utilize and develop scientific inquiry, analysis, and techniques to figure out the perpetrator. The 2nd & 3rd grade math classes will be a mix of strategic games and Scratch programming. The 4th & 5th graders will be focused on learning computer programming.

Parent volunteers will be needed for the SCIENCE classes – this helps us keep costs down. Please sign up below. It's fun and science knowledge is not needed.

This 7-week session will cost \$75 per child for math/programming and \$75 per child for science. If you are able to contribute toward the cost of your child's classes, please include a check for what you can afford. If you are able to contribute more it will help ensure we can continue to include everyone. Checks should be made out to SLED with "MaSC" in the memo field. *All* Roosevelt children are welcome to attend our classes, regardless of their family's ability to donate. Any donation you are able to give is tax deductible and will help us to continue bringing these classes to your children and those of other families.

To sign your child up for the math/programming class, the science class, or both, please fill out the application and turn it in to the office by the end of school on Wednesday, September 30.

Classes this session run for **7 weeks**, starting Monday, Oct 5 and ending Tuesday, November 17.

Classes meet in room A-4 except 4th/5th Programming which meets in the computer lab. If you choose to participate, your child would attend one or two classes per week according to this schedule:

Grade 2/3	Science Mondays 2:10–3:05pm	Math/Programming Tues 2:10–3:05pm
Grade 4/5	Science Mondays 3:10-4:10pm	Programming Tuesdays 3:10-4:10pm

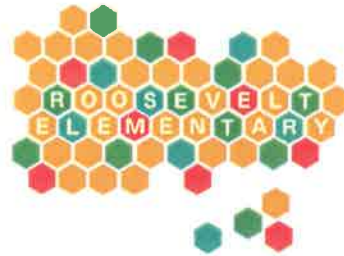
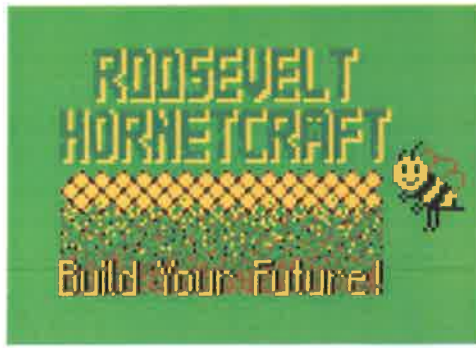
