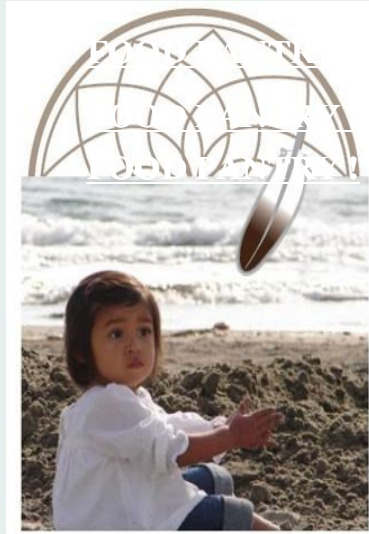
Cultural Enrichment Events

Indian Education Program is aimed at providing a variety of supportive services to help American Indian children reach their full potential in school.



Academic support - homework help and skill building activities in math and language arts from grades K – 12 throughout the school year. Ratio 3 students to 1 mentor.

Cultural Activities - .Focus on traditional Native American activities such as Native crafts, Native foods, traditional values, storytelling, field trips, and much more.

Summer school enrichment program. – Gives the children an added opportunity to reinforce their academic skills in a cultural context.

Parent Committee – The parents are an integral part of the program. Their input and contribution help shape the entire program.

Program serves 4 districts – Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE), San Leandro, San Lorenzo and Hayward.
