BINDER REQUIREMENTS GUIDE



Description

All students must keep a 3-ring binder for this course that will house and organize all coursework. **Do not put coursework from any other subjects in this binder!** This binder will be a valuable study tool throughout the year, especially for the College Board AP Exam. Binders must be kept up-to-date & brought to class each day.

Materials Needed

- 2" Binder Hard cover, 3-ring metal (plastic tends to break easily). Smaller than 2" will be too small!
- Sticky Notes Various sizes for class, but you can use small squares to create sub-tabs for your binder
- Tab Dividers: 15 sturdy BLANK tabs AND small sticky note squares to make unit sub-tabs.

<u>Organization</u> - *3 Major Sections*. <u>Label</u> 3 study tabs exactly as written below:

* Unit Content * Geography * Resources

<u>Filing System</u> Use the following <u>sub-tabs</u> to organize each section, respectively, and in this order:

- Unit Content (Keep <u>current</u> unit in binder. STORE/SAVE all "old" units somewhere super safe!)
 Create <u>6 sturdy sub-tabs</u> and organize directly <u>behind</u> the "Unit Content" Tab. <u>Label exactly as below</u>:
 (small sticky-note tabs work well too I suggest you make/# some during <u>each</u> of the 9 units this year)
 - Chapter Outlines
 - Include <u>your</u> textbook reading outlines, interactive notes & vocab for unit chapters
 - Lectures / Videos
 - Include lecture & video notes provided by online resources and/or viewed in class
 - Charts
 - Maps
 - Coursework
 - Include all coursework for the unit that doesn't fit into the above unit categories
 - Review
 - Include unit review material, including project pages and "big picture" summaries
- Resources (This will include quick reference materials used in the class all year).
 Create 6 sturdy sub-tabs and organize directly behind "Resources" Tab. Label exactly as below:
 - Avar Docs
 - Ex: Compass Partners, syllabus, analyzing artifacts, Binder Reqs, & Avar class resources
 - APWH (short for AP World History)
 - Ex: Course/AP Exam Overview, SPICE Themes, Timelines & "big picture" resources
 - Reading / Notes
 - Skill-building resources to improve reading & note-taking (ie. Cornell Notes, Costa's ?s)
 - \circ **DBQ**
 - Skill-building resources to navigate AP Document-Based Questions
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LEQ

- Skill-building resources to navigate AP Long Essays (Causation, CCOT, Comparison)
- \circ SAQ
 - Skill-building resources to navigate AP Short Answer Questions
- Geography (Includes global maps) No sub-tabs required
