



April and May are important months at school. April 15-19 is Spring Break. We have state testing for 3rd-5th graders beginning after Spring Break. We will start testing April 23rd and continue through May 10. Make up testing will follow. Please make sure to have students at school consistently during this time. Please do not schedule appointments during testing.

State Testing is important as it gives us information as to how our students are doing in their academic subjects; English Language Arts, Math, and Science (for fifth grade.) We want to promote a serious but relaxed testing environment.

During testing please make sure students get to sleep early so they are well rested. Bring students to school early so that they can have breakfast (for free) in the cafeteria, or give them breakfast before they come. Remind and support students to do their best and stay focused. We appreciate your partnership during testing to ensure our students do their absolute best!

April 12th will be our Multi-Cultural Family Dinner Dance in the MPR from 6-7:30. The school will provide a DJ and some food. Volunteers

A new application must be submitted every year. This is a board policy and everyone must comply whether you are volunteering one hour or every day. Please note that you may be asked to provide a current Tuberculosis (TB) screening and LiveScan Fingerprints dependent on the number of hours you plan to volunteer.

Reporting Absences

If your child is absent, you should always clear absences within 48 hours by either calling the attendance line 510-618-4341, sending a note to the office, or an email to: lgomez@slusd.us. After three days of absences, you are required to provide a doctor's note to the office. Tardy: Any student not in class by 8:10 am will be marked tardy.
