I hope everyone had a wonderful January. Our January ended with a lot of great activities. This Wednesday, students celebrated their 100th day of school. We read about how life was different long ago and compared schools of the past to James Madison. We learned about the long o sound and the long u sound. In math, students are practicing their place value and they did a great job playing a place value game. We continued to learn about American symbols in social studies as we read about the American flag and the White House. We celebrated the Kindness Challenge by discussing different ways we could be kind and sharing kind words with one another. We kicked off February today by learning about Groundhog's Day. I told the students that because tomorrow is Groundhog's Day, they may be able to find out if the groundhog saw his shadow by checking the weekend news.
