I was so proud of the class as they confidently completed their mid-module assessment. They did a wonderful job and now the class is using their knowledge to solve addition and subtraction problems. In language arts, students worked on their r controlled vowel words. We strengthened our understanding of adjectives, too. The class loves poetry and, as we explore it more, they are understanding different elements of poetry. This week, the students learned about onomatopoeia and created onomatopoeia word art.
